

Ntucha ụbụbọ nke okwu ọnụ Jega na ntuli aka elu izugbe Naijiria n'afọ 2015

Ntuli aka elu bụ otu n'ime usoro ochichị onye kwuo uche ya nke e ji enweta ochichị ọhụrụ. N'ímē ntuli aka elu na Naijiria, otu na-ahazi ntuli aka elu nke ndị oyibo kpọro *Electoral Management Board (EMB)* bụ otu ntuli aka elu izugbe nnorɔonwe, INEC. Na ntuli aka elu izugbe e mere na Naijiria n'afọ 2015, onye isi otu ndị na-ahazi ntuli aka elu, ọka nkuzi Attahiru Jega kwuru ụfodụ okwu. Site n'iji nchocha nkowa sovei (descriptive survey), nchocha a na-atucha okwu ọnụ Jega n'oge a na-eme ntuli aka elu izugbe n'afọ 2015 iji wee choputa usoro ndoko okwu onu ya na mputara ha. Nchocha ji atumatụ ukpuru mmekoriتا Grice na ntucha ụbụbọ kempuruchi (Critical Discourse Analysis) wee rụo ọru. Site na nchocha a, a choputara na ndoko okwu ọnụ abụo e ji rụo ọru nwere ngalaba anō ndị gunyere: ngalaba A (ekele na mkpólite); ngalaba B (okwu a kpụ n'ọnụ); ngalaba CH (ihe ndị na-eche aka mgba na ihe e merela gbasara ha), na ngalaba D (iji ozi olile anya na okwukwe were mechie). A choputara na a bịa na ngalaba A, Jega mezuru iwu okwukwu ezi okwu n'okwu A mana ọ dara iwu okwukwu ezi okwu n'okwu B nke mere ka ọ dachaa na mkparita ụka. Ozọ, nchocha choputara na ngalaba a emezughị iwu ndomanya n'ihi na ọ dighị nkenke. A kowaputara mputara okwu ọnụ Jega ebe a nöro hụ na ha dí mma.

Abstract

Election is one of the democratic processes of ushering in a new government. In the conduct of election in Nigeria, the Electoral Management Body (EMB) responsible is the Independent National Electoral Commission headed by a chairman. In the last Nigeria's general elections in 2015, the INEC chairman, Professor Attahiru Jega made some speeches. By adopting the descriptive survey research design, this paper analyses the speeches of Jega during the 2015 general elections in order to discover the structural patterns of the speeches and their outcomes. The paper adopts the Grice's cooperative principle and critical discourse analysis as its frameworks. From the study, the paper discovers that the structuring of the two speeches under study has four sections which include: section A (greetings and introduction), section B (situations at hand), section C (problems encountered and the solutions put in place), and section D (conclusion with messages of hope and faith). It was observed that in section A that Jega fulfilled the maxim of quality in speech A but flouted this maxim in speech B thereby committing a conversational implicature. Also, the research finds out that this section fails to fulfil the maxim of manner because it fails to be brief. The paper also discovers that the outcomes of the speeches and discovers that the outcomes are positively based than negatively based.

N'usoro ochichị Naijiria, e nwere alaka ato: nke etiti, steeti na okpuru ochichị. Onye isi ala na-achikwa gómenti etiti. Ọ bükwa ya bụ onye isi ndị agha ma burukwa onye kacha nwee ikike n'obodo. Ndị góvanọ na-achikwa steeti ma na-asopuru onye isi ala n'ego etiti ebe ndị isi oche na-elekota okpuru ochichị. A na-enweta onye isi ala ọhụrụ, góvanọ, onye isi oche n'okpuru ochichị site na ntuli aka elu. Ọ bụ ndị na-atụ vootu mgbe a na-eme ntuli aka elu na-emye onye isi ala ma ọ bụ ndị góvanọ ikike. Ntuli aka elu bụ otu n'ime njirimara ochichị onye kwuo uche ya.

N'otu aka ahụ, Bratton & Walle (1997) kwuru na ntụli aka elu bụ ọkpurukpu ihe di mkpa maka mmebe ochichị onye kwuo uche ya na ntowanye ya. Ha gara n'ihu ikwu na ntụli aka elu nō n'isi ihe a tịrụ anya n'aka ndị ama ala n'ochichị onye kwuo uche ya. N'iga n'ihu, Eminue (2001) kwuru na ntụli aka elu nke ochichị onye kwuo uche ya bụ ihe na-enye ndị na-atụ vootu ohere ịhorọ onye ndu ha na-atughị egwu ọ bụla na enwegeri mmanye ọ bụla. N'obodo ọ bụla nwere ochichị onye kwuo uche ya, otu na-ahazi ntulia aka elu bụ ha na-eme ka ntụli aka elu nwee isi.

Naijirịa dị ka obodo, na-ahazi ntụli aka elu izugbe kwa afọ anọ ọ bụla. Ime ntụli aka elu na-ekwe omume site n'agbamụmbọ INEC. Iwara (2010) kowara na otu na-ahazi ntụli aka elu pütara otu akwükwo iwu nyere ikihe ịhazzi ntụli aka elu n'afọ ọ bụla akwükwo iwu kwuru. O gara n'ihu ịrụtụ aka na otu na-ahazi ntụli aka elu gunyere ndokọ na usoro. Dị ka o si kwuo, ndokọ pütara ndị ọru gomentị e guzoro maka ịhazzi ntụli aka elu ebe usoro gunyere iwu na usoro na-achikwa mmebe ntụli aka elu. N'otu aka ahụ, Jinadu (1997) kowara mkpa na ọru otu na-ahazi ntụli aka elu dị ka ndị na-amaghị etu ntụli aka elu ga-esi bie. Ya bụ, ọnọdu a na-ahụ bụ na ndị tubuuru ugo na-abụ ndị e meriri ebe ndị e meriburu na-eturu ugo. Nke a, dị ka o si kowaa, bụ ọru otu na-ahazi ntụli aka elu na-eleghi anya n'ihu ọ bụla. Na Naijirịa, INEC ka ọ dị n'aka ịhazzi ntụli aka elu.

Kurfi (2005:10) kowapütara na site n'atụmatụ ochichị ndị agha nke Jeneral Abdusallami Abubakar ịhapụrụ ndị ochichị a kpobatara site n'usoro ochichị onye kwuo uche ya ike n'afọ 1999, e guzobere INEC dị ka otu ochichị site n'ikikere nke iwu ịhazzi usoro ntụli aka elu na Naijirịa. O gara n'ihu ịrụtụ aka na nguzobe INEC bụ nke isii n'otu ndị na-ahazi ntụli aka elu kemgbe Naijirịa bidoro chọwa ịbụ obodo ochichị onye kwuo uche ya na-achi. Otu ndị na-ahazi ntụli aka elu e nweburu na mbụ dị ka Kurfi (2000) siri kwuo gunyere; *Electoral Commission of Nigeria (ECN), Federal Electoral Commission (FEC), Federal Electoral Commission (FEDECO), National Electoral Commission (NEC)* na *National Electoral Commission of Nigeria (NECON)*. Jinadu (2011) mere ka a mara na mgbanwe aha e nyere otu na-ahazi ntụli aka elu ndị a bụ ịhụ na erughị eru na ihe mkpobi ụkwụ nke ochie agaghị abata na nke ọhụrụ. INEC, kemgbe a malitere ya, ahaziela ntụli aka elu ise gara nke ọma (1999, 2003, 2007, 2011, na 2015). Kemgbe e hiwere ya, ochichị INEC enweela ọtụtụ mgbanwe site n'aka Justice Ephraim Ayo Apata n'afọ 1998-2000; ruo n'aka Ọkm. Abel Guobadia 2000-2005; Ọkn. Maurice Iwu 2005-2010; Ọkn. Attahiru Jegede 2010-Junn 2015, Onye isi nörö oge nta; Odz. Amina Bala Zakari na onye nō ugbu a, Ọkn. Mahmud Yakubu.

Ntụli aka elu ikpe azụ na Naijirịa bụ n'ọnwa Maachị na Eprel ka e mere ya. Mgbe a na-akwado ntụli aka elu na mgbe ntụli aka na-abia na ngwucha, onye isi INEC onye hụrụ na ntụli aka elu gara nke ọma kwuru ụfodụ okwu, ọ bụ okwu ndị a ka nchöcha a chọrọ inyocha. O dị nnqo mkpa ka mmadụ, ọ kachasi onye isi INEC igwa ndị mmadụ okwu. Ndịna okwu ndị a nwere ike ịbụ ime ka ihe doo anya, ma ọ bụ igwa ndị mmadụ ihe na-eme. Obitube (2014) kwuru na ihe e ji amata ezigbo okwu bụ site na uru ọ bara. O gara n'ihu ikwu na a na-ebu otu ihe n'uche ma a na-ekwu okwu ọ bụla; ọ bürü na e mezuo ebunnuche a, a na-ekwu na okwu ahụ dị ire. N'ihii nke nke a, Chambers (2003) na nchoputa ya kwuru na mgbe ọ bụla anyị na-ekwu okwu, anyị anaghị ekpughe akparamagwa ụfodụ na ụfodụ mmasị naanị kama anyị na-ekpughe njirimara niile anyị na ndị mmadụ

nwekoritara ọnụ. N'otu aka ahụ, Agbedo (2015) kwuru na ụfodụ ihe dị ka ogo, abumnnne/abumoke, afọ, ọrụ, ogbe wdg. na-emetüta etu anyị si ekwu okwu.

Ka o sila dị, Obitube (2014) kwuru na e nwere ike iħuta uru okwu bara n'akukụ abụo. Akukụ nke mbụ dị ka o si kowaa, bụ site n'ilebanye anya n'akukụ okwuu. N'ebe a, ọ kowara na okwu e kwuru/nke a gwara ọha kwesiri ibu echiche okwuu bu n'obi ya. Ọ gara n'iħu ikwu na ozi ọzọ ọ bụla nke dị n'okwu nke na-emezughị echiche okwuu arubeghi ọrụ e dunyere ya. Akukụ nke abụo metütara ọnụ. O kwuru na ọ bụrụ na okwu akpalie mmuo ọnụ mee ya ka o nye ụdirị nzaghachi okwuu na-atụ anya, okwu ahụ bara uru. N'otu aka ahụ, ụdirị nzaghachi ndị a ka e nwere ike itinye n'owa nzisa ozi dị ka mmegharị ahụ, mmegharị isi, nsiakwụtọ, nnokete mmadụ na ibe ya, mmekorita anya na anya, na ọnodu ihu.

Ya bụ, ọ dị mkpa iħucha nke ọma ma kowaa asusụ na usoro okwu nke onye isi INEC gara aga, Oka nkuzi Attahiru Jega mgbe a na-eme ntụli aka elu izugbe Naijiria na 2015 nke na-ekpughe ebumnuche ya iji hụ na ntụli aka elu gara nke ọma na iħu na e chekwara ndu ndị mmadụ. Mbọ a niile bụ iħu na Naijiria bụ otu obodo bi n'udo. A na-ahütakarị ntụli aka elu na Naijiria dị ka ihe na-ebute nkwafo əbara na obi erughi ala. Kwaghga (2012) kowaputara na usoro ntụli aka elu na Naijiria nwere ụfodụ njirimara dị ka; ndị na-etozughi iħu vootu, ifunahụ igbe e ji atụ vootu, mwakpo anya si n'aka ndị agha. Etu Jega ji were asusụ n'izisa ozi, iwebilata ọnodu erughi ala na əgbaghara iji hụ na e nwere ntụli aka elu bụ igba, na-eleghi mmadụ ọ bụla anya n'iħu na nke nkwmotọ bụ ihe nchöcha a na-elebanye anya na ngalaba amumamụ asusụ na obodo. Asusụ anaghị ano naanị ya kama a na-etinye ya n'orụ n'obodo iji hụ na nghota ya pütara ihe. Nchöcha a na-elebanye anya n'okwu ọnụ Jega site n'ibu n'uche ikowami usoro ndoko na mpütara okwu ndị a.

Njime nchöcha a bụ okwu ntụli aka elu Jega kwuru. Okwu ndị a gunyere okwu o kwuru na Satodee, Febrewari 7, 2015 banyere oge na etu ntụli aka elu ga-esi gaa, na okwu gbasara etu e si mee ntụli aka elu nke o kwuru na Sondee, Maachị 29, 2015. Usoro njirime a gbasoro bụ usoro nchöcha kendaputa ma ọ bụ mberede (accidental sampling method). Ihe mere e jiri mee nke a bụ maka ọ bụ okwu abụo ndị e ji arụ ọrụ ka ndị nchöcha hụrụ n'owa intanet. Okwu ndị a dị n'asusụ bekee mana ndị a hoqo ka a tapiara n'asusụ Igbo. Ndịna okwu ndị a ka a ga-edeputa na mgbakwụnyere.

Ka o sila dị, ọ di mkpa ime nchöcha dị etu a ka e wee gosi ndị na-atụ vootu ihe ha kwesiri iħqota n'okwu Okn Jega na etu okwu ya siri nye aka medaa ndị mmadụ obi ma kwado ihe nke ọma maka iħu vootu na īnabata ka okwe siri gbaa na ntụli aka elu e mere. N'ime ya ka o doo anya, nchöcha ga-aza ajụjụ abụo ndị a:

- a. Kedu usoro ndoko okwu ọnụ Jega gbasoro?
- b. Kedu mpütara, ya bụ, uru okwu ọnụ Jega bara?

Nchoputa nchöcha a ga-abara ndị na-amụ sayensi asusụ, ndị na-amụ maka ndoro-ndorø ochichị, na ọha niile uru. A bịa na sayensi asusụ, ọ ga-enye aka kowaa na ka etu ndoko okwu si enye ihe niile e kwuru nghota n'izube. N'omumụ asusụ na obodo, ọ ga-akwado na okwu na-ebute udo ma ọ bụ əgbaghara n'obodo. N'ikpe azụ, ọ ga-egosiputa na atumatụ nnyocha ụbụbụ kempuruchi na ụkpuru mmekorita bakwara uru n'inyyocha okwu onye isi ndị na-ahazi atumvootu n'obodo ọ bụla ọ kachasi na Naijiria.

Ntule nnyocha ụbụbọ kempuruihe na ụkpuru mmekorita

Fairclough (2006) kowara na asusụ achumnta vootu nwere ike ịkpụ echiche na ebumnuche nke nwere ike igbanwe ihe a na-ahụ anya na ndụ, ikpuchi emereme dí na ndụ na ịkpughari ha. N'ikpughe emereme dí na ndụ na mpütara dí n'okwu ndị a, nchocha a ji Nnyocha Ụbụbọ Kempuruihe (NUK) iji tuchaa okwu ọnụ abụo Jega na ntuli aka elu izugbe 2015.

N'igba mbọ iweta ụkpuru a ga-eji rụo ɔru mgbe a na-agbaso usoro NUK, Huckins (1999) weputara ụkpuru. O kewara usoro ya uzo abụo; ntucha agwara edemede na-abughị kelingwistiiks na ntucha agwara kelingwistiiks. O kwuru na n'akukụ nke mbụ, otucha galebanye anya n'ederede n'uzo doro anya iji nweta ezi nghota ndịna, nke ga-emecha gosiputa ọnodụ ya. Ka e mechara, o ga-agughari ederede ahụ. N'oge a, o ga-etinye anya etu e si kpụo ndịna, etu e siri jiri isi okwu na ọkpurukpụ okwu kowaa ụfodụ okwu. Akukụ abụo nke ntucha gbadoro ụkwụ n'isiokwu kelingwistiiks a chọputara. N'ebe a, otucha na-elekwasanyanya n'ihe ndị a – ihe okwu na-ekwu maka ya na etu o si ekwu ya; usoro ọnodụ mmuo - mmekeorita okwu/onzara n'ekwumekwu; olu aktivu/pasivu – etu na ihe kpatara o ji were olu nke o bụla; ahịri okwu echiche nsonyere (presupposition) – echiche nsonyere a na-ahụ anya; mpütara – etu okwu si egosiputa nghota; ọnodụ - kedu olu na akanka e jiri mebe ederede? O kwuru na mgbe ụfodụ a na-eji nnöchi aha onye nke mbụ egosiputa ezi okwu ebe onye nke ato bụ nke e ji egosiputa asị.

Agbedo (2015) kwuru na o doro anya na nnyocha ụbụbọ kempuruihe dí ka ngalaba nnyocha ụbụbọ; na-ahụ maka mmekeorita dí n'etiti ụbụbọ na ike. N'otu aka ahụ, Idiagbon (2015:33) kowara na NUK abughị naanị maka ndorø-ndorø ochichị; o karịri ya. O na-atucha ụbụbọ site n'akukụ keuche, keobodo na keakukụ ala nke zoro ezo nye ọnụ ma o bụ ogụ. Ya bụ, ederede o bụla nwere mpütara 'nzuzo.' O gara n'ihu ikwu na ndị otucha NUK na-ekwu na e kwesiri iğụ ederede nke ọma ma gee ha nke ọma iji wee gbaa ozi 'nzuzo' ya n'anwụ. Ha na-eme nke a site n'ilebanye anya n'agwara ụbụbọ kelingwistiiks na nke abughị lingwistiiks dí ka o si metụta ọnụ na obodo. E nwere ike iji NUK rụo ɔru n'ubụbọ o bụla mmetutara asusụ - ndorø-ndorø ochichị, mgbasa ozi, mgbasa ozi ahịa, iwu, agumakwukwọ na ihe ndị ozọ. Ngalaba mmebere NUK nke akwukwọ a ga-eji rụo ɔru bụ iji okwu ọnụ n'ubụbọ ndorø-ndorø ochichị.

N'aka nke ozọ, atumatu ụkpuru mmekeorita si n'aka Paul Grice n'afọ 1975. Site n'igbado ụkwụ n'ebi o dí ukwu n'atumatu ihu Goffman, ọka mmüta a kwuru na e nwere iwu ndị nke o kporo 'ụkpuru' ndị na-ekwu okwu ga-edowe ma o bürü na ha choro ka mkparita ụka ha gaa nke ọma. Grice (1975:45) kwuru na ihe nọ n'isi na mkparita ụka bụ ihe o kporo ụkpuru mmekeorita: Mee ka ntunye gi na mkparita ụka dí etu a choro, n'ogo o pütara ihe, site n'ebumnuche na ọnodụ mkparita ụka i na-eme nabatara.

O kewara iwu ndị a uzo ano: iwu okwukwu ezi okwu, nhanole, ndomanya na ndabara. Iwu nhanole na-ekwu na okwu ga-eme ka ntunye ya dí etu a choro (n'okwu a kpụ n'ọnụ). O gaghị eme ka ntunye ya gafee etu a choro ya. Iwu okwukwu ezi okwu na-arụtụ aka na okwu ga-ekwu ezi okwu mgbe o bụla. O kwesighi ikwu ihe o ma na o bụ asị ma o bụ kwuo ihe na-edoghi ya anya. Iwu ndomanya na-akowa na okwu ga-eme ka okwu ya doo anya, dí nkenke ma kwe nghota. N'ikpe azụ, iwu ndabara na-ekwu na okwu ga-ekwuriri ihe dabara adaba nke bụ na ihe o na-ekwu ga-adaba n'okwu a kpụ n'ọnụ.

Ya mere, o bụ site n’iji atumatu abụo ndị a ka a ga-eji tuchaa okwu ọnụ abụo Jega. A ga-eji ükpurụ mmekorita tuchaa usoro ndokọ okwu ọnụ ebe a ga-eji NUK were tuchaa mputara okwu ndị a.

Ntucha usoro ndokọ okwu ọnụ Jega

N’ebé a, okwu ọnụ (okwu gbasara etu a ga-esi mee ntụli aka elu izugbe 2015, na okwu gbasara etu e si mee ntụlia aka elu) ka e lebanyere anya iji chọputara usoro ndokọ okwu ndị a. Site n’ebé a gawa, okwu nke mbụ ka a ga-akpọ ‘Okwu A’ ebe nke ọzọ ka a ga-akpọ ‘Okwu B.’ N’ime nke a, a ga-eji ükpurụ mmekorita tulee ndokọ a. Nke a dị mkpa n’ihí na o ga-enyere anyị aka ịmata ma ndokọ a o mezuru iwu anọ nke ükpurụ mmekorita. Ndokọ okwu ọnụ abụo a nwere ngalaba anọ ndị gunyere:

NGALABA A: Ekele na mkpolite
NGALABA B: Okwu a kpụ n’onu
NGALABA CH: Ihe ịma aka n’ihu na ihe e merela gbasara ha
NGALABA D: Iji ozi olile anya na okwukwe mechie

N’ịtule ngalaba nke mbụ, iwu nhanole nke na-ekwu na okwu kwasiri ime ka ntunye ya dị etu a chọro (dị ka o si daba adaba n’ihe a na-ekwu) ma għapu ime ka o gafee etu a chọro bụ ihe e mezuru. Tupu Jega agwa oha ndị mmadu ebūmnuche o ji kpoo nzukọ ahụ, o kelere onye o bula biaranụ mgbe o siri ndị nwoke na ndị nwaanyị (Ladies and Gentlemen). O gwara ha ebūmnuche e ji kpoo nzukọ nke bụ igwa ha mkpebi ndị INEC gbasara etu a ga-esi mee ntụli aka elu izugbe 2015. O gara n’ihu igwa ha mkpa o dì inyukota mamiri ọnụ iji hụ na ntụli aka elu gara nke ọma. N’okwu B, o kelere nnqo ndị Naijiria niile maka nkudososi ike ha n’oge ntụli aka elu. Ya mere, site na ntucha a, Jega mejuputara iwu nhanole na ngalaba A nke okwu ya.

Dị ka o si metueta iwu okwukwu ezi okwu, ngalaba A nke okwu Jega mejuputara iwu a n’okwu A maka na o bụ igwa oha mmadu ebe INEC kwụ gbasara etu a ga-esi mee ntụli aka elu ka e ji kpokpo nzukọ ahụ. Mana o dara iwu a n’okwu B mgbe o kwuru na INEC na-ekele ndị Naijiria maka iputa n’igwe na ntụli aka elu nke e mere n’udo. O buru na e lee anya, isi na e ji udo mee ya bụ ntụli aka elu abughị ihe a ga-ejide aka. Ihe e ji kwuo nke a bụ maka na e nwere ụfodụ ọgbaghara na nsogbu a hütara na ntụli aka elu izugbe 2015. Jega kwughagidere onwe ya mgbe o siri na ha natara ozi etu ndị Boko Haram siri mee ihe dị egwu nke gburu ụfodụ ndị ọru INEC. O gbawụnyere na ha eziela ndị ihe metutara ozi. Ya bụ, nke a mere ka udo na ọnụ ghara izu oke mgbe a na-eme ntụli aka elu. N’ihu nke a, ngalaba A nke okwu B Jega dara iwu okwukwu ezi okwu.

Ka o sila dị, na ngalaba A nke okwu Jega, ụfodụ ahịrị okwu mezuru iwu ndomanya dị ka ebe o nqo were nye nkowa okwu ichafu dị ka INEC (Independent National Electoral Commission) na EMB (Election Management Body). Mana ụfodụ akụkụ ngalaba a dara iwu a. Ebe ụfodụ o dara iwu a bụ mgbe o kwugharị n’okwu A ihe o gaara ichikọta n’otu ahịrị okwu. Ọmụma atụ, o kwuru na iħazi ntuli aka elu n’obodo dị ka Naijiria bụ ọru onye o bula na-abughị naanị otu na-ahazi ntuli aka elu, kama ndị ọru na-eru n’okwu, ndị otu nchekwa...sokwazi. Nghoṭa dị n’echiche a ka o kwugharị mgbe o siri na jħu na e mere ntụli aka elu nke ọma, e nwere ụfodụ ọru dīri naanị INEC nwekwaa ụfodụ ihe ndị ọzọ na-

adighi n'aka INEC. Okwu niile ndị a na-arụtu otu ihe aka nke bụ na ọganihu ntụli aka elu abughị ọru otu onye. Ya bụ, ọ dighi nkenke etu a choro.

Na ngalaba B nke metutara okwu a kpụ n'ọnụ, Jega kpugheere ndị mmadụ ihe na-eme. Site na data e nwetere, ngalaba B nke okwu Jega mezuru iwu nhanole n'ihi na o nyere ozi etu a choro ya nke nyere aka kowaara ndị mmadụ niile na ndị na-atụ vootu njikere INEC n'ime ntụli aka elu n'okwu A, na etu e sirila mee ntụli aka elu na steeti dị iche ihe n'okwu B. STATEMENT ON THE TIMETABLE FOR
2015 GENERAL ELECTIONS

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Introduction

We invited you here today to make known the position of the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) on the timetable for the 2015 general elections. Let me state from the outset that the Commission's position was reached after carefully weighing the suggestions from briefings held with different stakeholders in the electoral process.

The conduct of elections in a country like Nigeria is invariably a collective venture that involves not just the Election Management Body (EMB), but also a diverse range of stakeholders, notably security agencies, political parties and their candidates, voters, as well as interest groups, such as the civil society organizations and the media. To guarantee successful conduct of elections, there are things that are wholly the responsibility of the EMB. But there are other things critical for the success of elections, which fall outside the control of the EMB.

In other words, while INEC must work hard to perfect its systems and processes for conducting elections, and take responsibility for any imperfections thereof, whatever the Commission does may not by itself be sufficient to guarantee the success of elections. There are a number of issues in the preparation and conduct of an election, the most critical of which is security, which is not under the control of INEC.

Current State of INEC's Preparedness

On Thursday, February 5, 2015, I was invited to brief the National Council of State, which is the highest advisory to the President comprising past and present leaders in Nigeria, on the level of preparedness of INEC to conduct the 2015 general elections. I made a presentation to the Council titled 'Preparations for the 2015 General Elections: Progress Report,' in which I gave a detailed account of what the Commission has been doing in readiness for the national elections (National Assembly and Presidential) scheduled for February 14th, and the state elections (Governorship and State Assembly) scheduled for February 28th, 2015.

The summary of my presentation to the National Council of State meeting is that, for matters under its control, INEC is substantially ready for the general elections as scheduled, despite discernible challenges being encountered with some of its processes like the collection of Permanent Voter Cards (PVCs) by registered members of the public.

In addition, INEC has been doing everything it can to facilitate the collection of the PVCs by registered members of the public. As at 5th February 2015, the total number of PVCs collected was 45, 829, 808, representing 66.58% of the total number of registered voters.

In the delivery and deployment of electoral materials, INEC is also at a comfort level in its readiness for the general elections as scheduled (see the presentation to the Council of State). The Commission's preparations are not yet perfect or fully accomplished. But our level of preparedness, despite a few challenges, is sufficient to conduct free, fair and credible elections as scheduled on February 14th and February 28th. Compared with 2011 when, within a short time, we conducted general elections that were universally adjudged free, fair and credible and the best in Nigeria's recent electoral history, our processes are today better refined, more robust and therefore capable of delivering even better elections.

Other Variables

But as I mentioned earlier, there are some other variables equally crucial for successful conduct of the 2015 general elections that are outside the control of INEC. One important variable is security for the elections.

While the Commission has a very good working relationship with all security agencies, especially on the platform of the Inter-agency Consultative Committee on Election Security (ICCES) since its inception in 2010, it has become pertinent for it to seriously consider the security advisory presented to it by the Security and Intelligence Services. I would like to reiterate here that INEC is an EMB and not a security agency. It relies on the security services to provide a safe environment for personnel, voters, election observers and election materials to conduct elections wherever it deploys. Where the security services strongly advise otherwise, it would be unconscionable of the Commission to deploy personnel and call voters out in such a situation.

Last Wednesday, which was a day before the Council of State meeting, the office of the National Security Adviser (NSA) wrote a letter to the Commission, drawing attention to recent developments in four Northeast states of Borno, Yobe, Adamawa and Gombe currently experiencing the challenge of insurgency. The letter stated that security could not be guaranteed during the proposed period in February for the general elections.

This advisory was reinforced at the Council of State meeting on Thursday where the NSA and all the Armed Services and Intelligence Chiefs unanimously reiterated that the safety and security of our operations cannot be guaranteed, and that the Security Services needed at least six weeks within which to conclude a major military operation against the insurgency in the Northeast; and that during this operation, the military will be concentrating its attention in the theatre of operations such that they may not be able to provide the traditional support they render to the Police and other agencies during elections.

INEC's Decision

We have done wide ranging consultation to enable us have as much input as is necessary before taking an informed decision. In the series of consultations that we held with stakeholders, the questions consistently posed to them for consideration are:

In view of the latest development, should INEC proceed with the conduct of the general elections as scheduled in spite of this strong advice; and if so, what alternative security arrangements are available to be put in place? Or, should INEC take the advice and adjust the schedules of the general elections within the framework of Constitutional provisions?

The Commission held a meeting after the consultations, and decided to take the advice of the Security Chiefs and adjust the dates of the elections. We have done this relying on Section 26(1) of the Electoral 2010 (As Amended), which states thus: "Where a date has been appointed for the holding of an election, and there is reason to believe that a serious breach of the peace is likely to occur if the election is proceeded with on that date or it is impossible to conduct the elections as a result of natural disasters or other emergencies, the Commission may postpone the election and shall in respect of the area, or areas concerned, appoint another date for the holding of the postponed election, provided that such reason for the postponement is cogent and verifiable".

INEC not being a security agency that could by itself guarantee protection for personnel and materials, as well as voters during elections, the Commission cannot lightly wave off the advice by the nation's Security Chiefs. The Commission is specifically concerned about the security of our ad hoc staff who constitute at least 600,000 young men and women, together with our regular staff, voters, election observers as well as election materials painstakingly acquired over the last one and half years. This concern is limited not just to the areas in the North-eastern part of Nigeria experiencing insurgency; the risk of deploying young men and women and calling people to exercise their democratic rights in a situation where their security cannot be guaranteed is a most onerous responsibility. Under such circumstances, few EMBs across the world, if any, would contemplate proceeding with the elections as scheduled. No matter the extent of INEC's preparedness, therefore, if the security of personnel, voters, election observers and election materials cannot be guaranteed, the life of innocent young men and women as well the prospects of free, fair, credible and peaceful elections would be greatly jeopardised.

Consequently, the Commission has decided to reschedule the 2015 general elections thus: the national elections (i.e. Presidential and National Assembly) are now to hold on March 28th, 2015; while the state elections (Governorship and State Assembly) are to hold on April 11th, 2015. It should be noted that this rescheduling falls within the constitutional framework for the conduct of the elections, notably, Sections 76(2), 116(2), 132(2) and 178(2). See also Section 25 of the Electoral Act 2010 (As Amended).

For the avoidance of doubt, we will under no circumstances approve an arrangement that is not in line with the provisions of our laws. Our hope is that with this rescheduling, the security services will do their best to ensure that the security environment needed for safe and peaceful conduct of the 2015 elections is rapidly put in place.

We in INEC reassure all Nigerians and indeed the international community of our commitment to do everything within the law and to conduct free, fair, credible and peaceful elections. We call on the security agencies to honour their commitment to restore sufficient normalcy for elections to take place within the period of extension. We also call on Nigerians, political parties, candidates and all other stakeholders to accept this decision in good faith and ensure the maintenance of peace.

As for us in INEC we'll endeavour to use the period of the extension to keep on perfecting our systems and processes for conducting the best elections in Nigeria's history. In particular, we

believe that we would resolve all outstanding issues related to non-collection of PVCs, which agitate the minds of many Nigerians.

Finally, we wish to call on all Nigerians to accept our decision, which is taken in good faith and the best interest of deepening democracy in our country.

INEC CHAIRMAN, PROFESSOR ATTAHIRU JEGA'S STATEMENT ON THE CONDUCT OF POLLS ON MARCH 29, 2015.

"INEC wishes to commend Nigerians for their large turnout and peaceful conduct during the elections. The Commission commends Nigerians for the resilience and understanding exhibited in the face of these difficulties"

"We hope good conduct will continue to prevail throughout the election period as well. The Commission is pleased that the elections went on smoothly across the country including the North-East where Internally Displaced Persons voted (Adamawa, Yobe, Borno)."

"It is also gratifying to note that the card readers worked well in the majority of the Polling Units (PUs). Though there were areas where the difficulties experienced necessitated additional guidelines. The guidelines by the Commission allow for manual accreditation of voters as announced yesterday."

"Osun, Kebbi, Ekiti, Adamawa, Borno, Jigawa, Anambra, Akwa Ibom and Ebonyi state reported manual accreditation in some PUs. As a result of these difficulties, elections could not be concluded yesterday in a few PUs and voting is underway today."

"I can tell you certainly that the failure of card readers surprised us and it is probable that the POs were not trained."

"The Commission conducted voting for IDPs in the NE, although with a few reported security incidents. It is heartwarming that the elections went well in a substantial number of the PUs across the country notwithstanding challenges."

"We commend the security agencies for their vigilance and dedication. In the course of the elections yesterday, the Commission has received reports of security challenges in some states that were repelled."

"Only the INEC is empowered by law to announce results and it is an offence for anyone to preempt the Commission in this regard."

"You start counting 48 hours when substantial amount of polling units have concluded elections. According to the reports from our state offices, collation of results has commenced and it is going well."

"We received reports of a boko haram attack and a few ad-hoc staff of INEC lost their lives. We have reached out to the family of the bereaved and it is an unfortunate event."

"We received reports of underage voting from Taraba and we have instructed that the PO involved be identified. Underage voting is against the law, we are investigating reports and will take measures once this is established."

“This morning, I received a letter from APC calling for elections cancellation in Rivers, we are thoroughly investigating this. After investigation, we will brief the political parties of our findings.”
“If we find out that our staff are involved in any illegal acts, they will be investigated and penalized according to the law.”

“It is true our INEC office in Rivers state was torched, we have informed police authorities. We have asked for additional security so this does not occur again.”

“We will declare results when it has been collated from the states. You start counting 48 hours when substantial amount of polling units have concluded elections.”

“Collation of results will begin at 12pm tomorrow. We are not under any pressure to declare inconclusive elections.”

The elections were slated to hold only on March 28 but were extended to the 29th due to difficulties experienced in some areas.
